

The Holiday Schedule

The **ONLY** days that we will be delayed on are:

New Year's Day
Memorial Day
Independence Day
Labor Day
Thanksgiving Day
Christmas Day

If any of these holidays fall on a weekend they will **NOT** be delayed. Whenever a scheduled collection day falls on a holiday, that day's collection and all remaining collections for the week will be delayed one day. Friday's collections will be on Saturday.

Mendon Curbside Recycling

Recycling must be out by 7:00 a.m. along with trash
Paper must be in a separate container
Plastics 1 – 7, Glass, Tin may be placed in same container

Paper recycling is picked up one week
Plastics, glass and tins are picked up the other week

Paper

Newspaper with inserts, magazines, catalogs, phone books, paperboard (e.g. cereal boxes), and office paper.

Corrugated cardboard – flattened and tied in 2' X 2' bundles.

Containers

Glass bottles/jars - remove lids, corks, neck rings etc.

Tin, steel and aluminum food cans & lids, deposit & non-deposit beverage cans – may be flatten.

Plastic containers with narrow necks – remove lids and neck rings.

Not allowed in recycling

No soiled paper, No plastic bags, No pizza boxes

No broken or other glass such as light bulbs, window or auto glass, dishes, glasses, or Pyrex.

No aluminum foil.

No cans containing hazardous material, paint or aerosol.

No motor oil or chemical containers.
